"Recruitment is at the top of Goldberg's list of priorities as he helps Pashman Stein get the Philadelphia office

off the ground. He is primarily focusing on attorneys specializing in corporate and transactional work, real estate and intellectual property, with room for commercial litigators and white collar attorneys.

Discussing why he made the move to Pashman Stein, Goldberg was quoted as saying that "he moved his practice to Pashman Stein after nearly 22 years with Duane Morris for the opportunity to work with "incredibly skilled and talented lawyers," and to have the "unique experience of building an office from the ground floor."
